- Hosted just over 85 events outside of CFC and SCU
- Plenty of discussions with Counsel and FQ over the year regarding honey farm, the most recent one being yesterday but as far as we know the current move in date is early 2027 ready for the season.

When we first took over from the previous committee we found a debt of over \$200,000 which we significantly reduced in the 2024 season, but can now officially say that we are in the green and have no outstanding debts with anyone.
